

BRITISH AIRWAYS INTERVIEWS THE PRESIDENT

On 1 December 2008, two Special Report representatives from the British Airways Media came and interviewed UTAR President, Engr. Prof. Dato' Dr. Chuah Hean Teik at the **Petaling Jaya Campus.**

The interview was for a special report and feature on Malaysia to be published in the British Airways' High Life in-flight magazine which has a global readership annually of over 43 million.

During the interview, Prof. Chuah talked about the progress of UTAR and his aspirations for the University.

Emphasising a strong feature of UTAR, Prof. Chuah said, "UTAR is unique compared to many other private universities because it is a not-for-profit organisation that runs on contributions made by the public. Without the need to focus on making profits, the University can channel its revenues to continuously enhance the quality of its programmes for the benefit of the students."

He added, "UTAR programmes are designed to train students to think critically, problem-solve effectively and use the knowledge they gain from their University experience to update themselves with new skills to meet the changing needs of the respective industries. The ability will then enable them to excel in their chosen careers."

Prof. Chuah also aspired to bring UTAR to greater heights in the international education arena. He said, "I do hope that UTAR will have 10% of international students in the next 5 years. It good to create an international is environment for our students so that they will have the opportunity to learn about different cultures, improve the way they think and network with friends from different countries."

"UTAR is currently in the midst of building its international connections. As part of the University's effort in going global, UTAR has forged collaborations with various institutions of higher learning worldwide."

He expressed his desires for UTAR academics to continue developing their skills and talents to be at par with international standards by producing research journals and obtaining research grants on a regular basis.

When asked to name a UTAR achievement that would make him most proud of if it were to occur during his stewardship in UTAR, he smiled and said, "I would very much like UTAR to become the preferred University of all Malaysians. When that happens, I can then retire happily."

UTAR Students' Creative Works Shortlisted for Film Festival

Two teams from UTAR were named as the top five teams in both the documentary and short film categories in the Super Pitch qualifying round of the *Anugerah Perdana* of the *Festival Filem dan Video Pelajar Malaysia Keenam* (FFVPM6) on 10 November 2008 at Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM). Being in the top five gives the two teams a chance to secure the top prizes and awards at the Festival in January 2009.

FFVPM is a project created to help develop the Malaysian film industry as well as to acknowledge the excellent film works of students. The event was organised by the National Film Development Corporation Malaysia (FINAS) in collaboration with Malaysian institutions of higher learning.

To participate in the FFVPM6, one must be a student from a public or private institution of higher learning in Malaysia. To make it into the finals of the *Anugerah Perdana*, all contestants must submit their proposals consisting of original stories that have not been aired or submitted in any previous FFVPM to the organisers.

The teams with good proposals are selected to pitch their ideas in front of a panel of judges consisting of professionals from the broadcasting and production industry at the Super Pitch qualifying round. Only the best five teams from each category are chosen to compete in the final round of the *Anugerah Perdana*.

A total of 40 teams from public and private institutions of higher learning participated in the Super Pitch. A team from UTAR with its story entitled *Rewind* was shortlisted and awarded RM2,500

to produce their short film while another team from UTAR with its story entitled *Witty Wings* was shortlisted and awarded RM2,000 to produce their documentary. Both teams will have to produce their stories from 15 November to 14 December to compete in the final round.

In describing his experience at the Super Pitch, Gareth Chin Fui Hian, UTAR team leader for the short film said, "The pitch happened to be my first time presenting to a group of industry professionals. Through this experience, I found out that the difference between presenting to industry professionals and presenting to my lecturers is that I need to try harder in convincing the professionals to accept my ideas."

Quek Shio Chuan, UTAR team leader for the documentary team expressed, "Before the pitch, my team mates and I did a lot of research on the documentary topic that we proposed. With all the effort taken, I was able to present our topic to the judges confidently. The presentation was done in a PowerPoint format and it included photos of the people that we would be interviewing, the locations of the documentary as well as our proposed production schedule."

The production of both the teams from UTAR will be aired in UPM during the three-day Festival from 8-10 January 2009. At the Festival, the teams' entries will stand a chance to win awards and/or prizes from the *Anugerah Perdana*. Results of the *Anugerah Perdana* will be announced on the final day of the Festival.

When enquired about the possibility of having a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between both universities, Murphy revealed, "Westminster and UTAR are actually in the process of finalising the MoU."

Prof. Chadwick and Murphy also met with the second and final year students from the Faculty of Accountancy and Management at the Bandar Sungai Long Campus. In the meeting, Murphy shared with the students about study life in bustling London, the courses offered by University of Westminster and the scholarships available to deserving students.

University of Westminster, situated at the heart of London, was founded in 1838. It was Britain's first polytechnic and the fourth college to award degrees in England.

PEER HELPING PROGRAMME AT UTAR

While society gets more and more impersonal in today's lifestyle, UTAR strives to develop a caring University community by encouraging more students to care for others by equipping them with useful counselling skills through the Peer Helping Programme.

Organised by the Counselling Unit of the Department of Student Affairs of UTAR, the programme is specially designed for students who desire to provide care and a listening ear to other students through a helpful relationship.

Students who participate in the programme are prepared to become Peer Helpers through lectures, group presentations, discussions, exercises and role-play sessions. They are taught on personal growth, some basic counselling skills and some problem-solving approaches in counselling. Among some of the interesting topics explored in the programme are family, personal and mental health issues as well as substance abuse and sexuality.

Many students have benefited from their involvement in the Peer Helping Programme.

Tan Chao Qun, a second year student from the Psychology degree programme described his experience. He said, "The programme has helped me a lot in understanding my studies better as it has given me the opportunity to gain extra knowledge on counselling techniques in addition to what I learn during my classes."

Sally Sim Shian Wei, another Psychology student added, "The programme has not only enhanced my lectures but also provided me with useful knowledge to help me counsel my friends whenever they face challenges. The programme has also taught me to practise good stress management especially when handling my tight study schedules."

First Aid Training for Emergency Situation

UTAR students had the opportunity to learn additional skills beyond the classroom when the Federation of Private Medical Practitioners' Malaysia in collaboration with the St. John Ambulance Malaysia (SJAM) conducted a first aid training session at the University's campus in Petaling Jaya on 16 November 2008.

Dr Goh Kay Chee, the President Elect for the Private Medical Practitioners' Society for Kuala Lumpur and Selangor was the guest of honour. Also present were Dr Chooi Yuo Hoo, Mr Steven Wong Tuck Meng, Deputy Area Commander of St John Ambulance Malaysia (SJAM) and Jeffery Nah Swee Sing, the facilitator of the day.

The main objective of the training was to educate the students on the importance of life-saving skills and their utility for emergency preparedness and response.

The Chairperson for First Aid Society in UTAR, Ng Xing Pei said, "First aid training is essential as we might face emergency any time. During emergency, we can then take prompt action in those circumstances. I feel everyone should have this skill and it is great that we can learn a skill that can help people."

The trainer briefed the students on first aid techniques, answered their enquiries, showed them how to give first aid before getting them to participate in an emergency drill.

"The first aid training is important as we are not only gaining knowledge. In fact, we are also learning some life skills, which will be very useful in our life and can benefit many people too," commented Chew Kar Poh, the Vice-Chairperson of First Aid Society in UTAR's Faculty of Accountancy and Management.

Secrets of the Three Gorges Dam Revealed

Some 200 people gained first-hand knowledge from Professor Dr. C.F. Lee, a consultant for the Three Gorges Dam project as he provided insights on the building of the dam during a seminar/forum held on 8 November 2008 at the Eastin Hotel, Petaling Jaya.

The Three Gorges Dam, built on the Yangtze River at Sandouping in China, measures up to 2,335 metres in length and is the largest hydroelectric dam in the world.

The seminar/forum was jointly organised by UTAR and the Asian Centre for Media Studies of The Star (Star-ACMS). Present to declare open the seminar/ forum was Tun Dr. Ling Liong Sik, Council Chairman of UTAR.

During the seminar/forum, Prof. Lee shared, "Although the Three Gorges Dam currently generates huge amount of electricity, the main reason in building the dam was not for electrical power generation. It was for flood control. Yangtze River is known as the second killer river in China as it has claimed many lives through its flood history. The river is connected to many other rivers and lakes, including hanging rivers which cause floods."

Apart from that, Prof. Lee also explained the cutting-edge technologies used in constructing and maintaining the dam such as the tunnels used to remove silt and to control water levels in electrical power plants, and the two-way ship lifts that enable ships to pass through the dam.

A forum led by a panel of engineering experts was held after the seminar. The discussions included the impacts of the dam on its surrounding ecology, the construction and maintenance of the dam, the costs incurred in constructing and maintaining the dam, and the amount of revenue generated by the dam.

Many found the seminar/forum enriching. Ir.

Dr. Tew Kia Hui, an environment consultant for the Bakun Hydroelectric Project in Malaysia commented, "The seminar helped me to widen my knowledge on the latest technologies that can be used in dam construction and maintenance. Some of the things that I have learnt are the landslide monitoring system and early warning system for flood used in the Three Gorges Dam."

长江是中国第一长河,自古以来便不断发生洪灾。为了防洪,中国人不断地筑高堤坝。李教授以长江最易泛滥的河段——荆江悬河为例。由于荆江地势低洼,长江带来的泥沙不断沉积,致使河床高过两岸平原,形成"人在江底走,水在头上流"的情形。千年来两岸人民一直修筑防堤以减低洪水的威胁。

然而,筑堤防洪也只是治标不治本的方法。他指出,水患的根源 是人民不断砍伐树木,使植被遭到破坏,造成水土流失。另外,长江 下游大规模的围湖造田活动也降低湖泊的蓄洪能力。为改善此情况, 1998年始,中国政府禁止人们在长江中上游伐树,同时植树造林以改 善生态环境。

为解除洪灾的危害,孙中山在《实业计划》中首次提出在长江兴 建水坝的设想。后来由于种种原因,这项计划被迫搁置下来,至1992 年始被通过,并于1994年正式动工。

不过,三峡工程对周围环境带来的影响是不容小觑的,因此拟定 必要的对策也是当务之急。作为中国人类居住时间最长的地区之一, 长江流域一带拥有丰富的文物古迹与风景名胜。但是,三峡水坝一旦 蓄水,一些景区和文物将永埋水底。李教授说,为保护这些古迹,中 国政府在1992年便展开抢救行动,以期在大坝蓄水前完成发掘、迁移 和保护工作。他举例说,汉代墓葬、忠县石宝寨、云阳张飞庙、涪陵 石鱼等都得到了适当的安排。

水坝的建造也影响周围的生态环境,其中之一就是中国的特产鱼 类——中华鲟鱼。为避免工程影响该鱼类的生存,中国政 府以人工方式繁殖,确保它不会绝种。

由于水坝蓄水后将淹没沿江一些城市,受影响的居民人数庞大, 因此移民也是此工程面对的另一难题。如何安置他们成了中国政府重 要的任务。中国政府以迁移当地人民至新成立的省份,或迁移到其他 省份等方式安顿当地人民。

李教授也与在场者分享了选择三斗坪为最终坝址的原因。他说, 由于三斗坪地势开阔,地质为坚硬的花岗岩,并且江中拥有中堡岛, 有利于大坝的分期施工。因此该处是最适合建造水坝的地方。

李教授精彩的演说让出席者加深了对三峡工程的认识。讲座结束 后,即有研讨会,为出席者解答关于三峡工程的疑问。这场专题讲座 暨研讨会为有关领域的专业人士提供了一个交流和学习的平台。



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台湾国立交通大学到访拉曼

拉曼大学理工学院于11月13日(星期四)上午,接待了来 自 台 湾 国 立 交 通 大 学 的 两 位 代 表 —— 资 讯 工 程 学系与生医工程研究所教授蔡德明博士以及电子工程系教授王圣 智博士。两位教授此行的主要目的是商讨交换学生计划事宜。

观赏了拉曼大学介绍短片后,王圣智教授便为我校教职员介 绍有关交通大学的概况。交通大学共有八所学院和七百余位全职 教员。由于该校较重视研究,因此研究生比本科生多。

交通大学在工程与电脑科学方面有骄人的表现。王教授说, 交通大学在上海交通大学公布的2008年世界大学术排名中,榜上 有名。除此,在2007年世界大学排名中,该校也在"工程与电脑 "方面名列第49,领先台湾各大学,显示出该校在是项专业领域 里的研究实力。

王教授也透露,交通大学其中一个优势是坐落在科学工业 区附近。该工业区拥有约四百家企业机构,而该校也与当中的一 些机构建立了紧密的合作关系。因此,就读该校的学生将有机会 到那些机构实习,从中可第一时间获得有关领域的经验与知识。 若拉曼大学能够派学生到该校实习,可谓百利而无一害。另外, 该校也提供生活津贴予交换学生。

交通大学大部分的课程皆以中文为教学媒介语,不过电机 资讯国际学位课程在未来将会开办以英文教学的课程。

接着蔡德明教授为大家介绍该校的资讯学院。据他透 露,该学院属下设有20个研究小组,并与校外各大机构及研究所 合作研究。迄今,该学院已成功研发出台湾第一部小型电脑、第 一架中文打字盘和第一个工业机械人等。

尔后,拉曼大学理工学院长黄展群博士介绍理工学院 的课程及研究方向,如脑科学、奈米科学等;林树钦博士也简述 了拉曼大学资讯与通讯科技学院的概况。

双方代表进一步讨论了有关交换学生的计将会挑选学 生到交通大学实习。然而,由于无法转移学分,因此我校学生不 能在交通大学上课。

警报铃声响起后,约六百位教职员与学生都即刻到达集合 场地,整个过程仅花费了七分钟。该小组也安排了一些学生充 当指挥人员。他们负责指挥与带领其余学生,利用紧急出口到 达集合场地。

紧急应变与疏散小组成员在演习结束后进行了简单的检讨 会议,讨论演习过程中需要改善的部分并提出建议,以便能在 未来的演习里做得更好。

基础课程中心职员邬子祥表示,这次的演习活动让他学习 到逃生的技巧。他说:"若是发生火灾,我知道应该如何逃离 现场,也知道该到哪里集合。"不过,他也指出,这次的火灾 演练仍有须改进的地方,"一些地方,如实验室的警报器铃声 太小,无法听得清楚。加上实验室里有很多化学物品,一旦发 生火灾,实验室就会变成最危险的地方了。"他认为,应在实 验室附近安装多些铃声较高的警报器。

拉曼大学副校长(学生进展与校友联系事务)杨碹宝 博士说:"设立软技巧学系部的宗旨,是透过开办各种软技

听寻探亲,采集乡音

语言不仅是人类的交流工具,也是文化的承载体,是民族 的重要特征。早期华人南下到马来西亚时,也把自身籍贯的语 言和文化带来这片土地。在经历了几代的发展,及多种文化与 语言的影响下,如今大马华人使用的方言,是否产生了变化?

为了探讨与采集各种方言在我国的发展,拉曼大学中文系 副教授谢爱萍博士将进行《马来西亚华人乡音采集计划》。为 此,于2008年11月七日上午,在八打灵再也晶冠酒店举行了《 马来西亚华人乡音采集计划》新闻发布会暨推介礼。当天的推 介人是新闻部副部长拿督陈莲花。谢爱萍博士也代表拉曼大学 校长拿督蔡贤德教授出席了是项推介礼。

拿督陈莲花认为,乡音是丰富的文化遗产,隐藏在内的人 文价值和历史,值得发扬光大。她说,乡音是传承中华文化重 要的环节,这项计划将能完整并有系统地保留此文化予后代。 "乡音采集计划能拉近全世界华人的距离,研究成果将成为国 际性的收藏和参考。"拿督陈莲花致词时也建议让更多年轻人 参与这项计划,以引起他们的学习兴趣。

谢博士是《马来西亚华人乡音采集计划》的总策划。谢博 士原先的计划是研究广东省的方言。其后,由于得到外界的支 持,经过一番思量后,决定将之改成研究我国各方言的发展, 继而造就了《马来西亚华人乡音采集计划》的诞生。

她透露,这项计划预计费时一年。她将会收集各地可采集 对象的资料,过后进行分类、筛选和鉴定工作。最后,她会制 定采集路线及行程。采集小组的成员会根据她制定的地图,下 巧培训讲座和其他活动,培育学生的软技巧与生活技能。"这样一来,日后他们不仅能够在竞争激烈的社会里立足,在生活上也能得心应手。

她补充道:"通过参与这些活动,学生可以学习到课 堂以外的新事物,并有机会与经验丰富的培训人员交流。 这不但能够发展他们的潜能,也可以提升他们对自我价值 的认识。"

"明年1月,校方将推介新的文凭制度一 拉曼大学软技巧培训文凭。这个新制度的主要目的,是鼓 励更多学生积极参与活动,以全面地提升自己,训练自律 能力和激发创意,同时培育思域广阔并具有国际视野的未 来栋梁。校方将颁发文凭予参与软技巧学系部举办的活动 之学生,作为他们参加培训的证明。这个制度亦可帮助校 方记录学生在校时的课外活动表现,以及他们的活跃程度 。"

要得到这张文凭,我校学生须在求学时期,从五种类型项目中选择参加其中四个,累积至少100分。这五种类型是沟通与语言、修为与道德、情感智力、团队与领袖精神、创新与战略思维和企业精神。此制度将确保学生掌握更多不同的软技巧。学生可以透过参加各种课外活动,如工作坊、讲座、比赛等来累积分数。软技巧学系部会根据学生的参与程度,给予"及格"至"特优"的评估。

她表示, 拉曼大学将根据学生领袖持有的职位,给 予他们每年一百至三百令吉不等的奖励金,让他们参与这 些课程。若求学时期无暇参加,他们可保留该奖励金,并 在毕业后的两年内回校参与。拉曼大学校友亦能回来参加 这些课程,学费与在籍学生一样。日后若学习有成,还可 以成为拉曼大学软技巧讲座和课程的导师。

乡进行采集工作。乡音采集的类别包括歌谣、民间艺人创作、 戏曲、口述自传、历史事迹和地方性民间故事。研究成果将以 光碟、影音记录片和书籍等形式发表。为了更全面地窥探方言 的发展,谢博士将采集各年龄阶层的方言。她表示,此计划的 研究员将由拉曼大学与马来亚大学的硕士生担任。

谢爱萍博士同时也是拉曼大学中国研究组主任。中国研究 组成立于2005年,原本隶属于高等学位研究学院。其设立的宗 旨是研究当代中国。

乡音是研究本土华人不可或缺的部分。纵然受到使用空间 的局限,但方言的地位仍是不可取代的。随着这项计划的展 开,不仅能有效地维护和保存这无形的文化遗产,其研究成果 也将成为后人宝贵的参考文献。

蔡校长认为科技是事物迅速发展的导因之一。全球化的趋势为 我们提供许多机会,但也意味着我们须要和更多人竞争。知识就是 生。他鼓励学生建立自己的人际网络,并强调人脉对以人为本的 力量,因此世界的转变将倾向以人为本,强调知识的革新。他说, 知识型经济的成功关键在于人力资本,就连第九大马计划也强调培 的眼光放远,勿局限在一个小框框,不仅要踏出本国,更要向亚 育人才。在全球的竞争市场上,我们必须提高产品素质、竞争力、 生产及服务素质。

联系与疏离: 东南亚华人与 近代中国的互动

2008年11月28日, 拉曼大学创意产业学院中文系与台湾 政治大学文学院历史系联办了一场研讨会,以学术的角度 探讨东南亚华人与近代中国的互动。这场研讨会于当天上 午在拉曼大学延续教育中心举行,集合了马来西亚、台湾 与日本东京大学三地的研究生进行交流。
