An ACCA affiliate refers to a candidate who has completed all the

required ACCA papers, pending completion of three years of working experience. Young has attained one of the highest total average marks in his professional exams upon achieving the affiliate status.

Young mentioned that technology would affect the way people work and advised people to keep pace with all the latest technological developments. Chong expressed his wish to obtain more skills in banking and finance as well as more exposure in the business sector.

UTAR Lee Kong Chian Faculty of Engineering and Science students, namely Au Jin Cheng, Yap Sheng Yao, Khor Jun Bin, Lim Wen Qing and Tan Kai Siang, have been selected as finalists in Keysight Technologies, Inc.'s IoT Innovation Challenge. Led by lecturer-cumadvisor Danny Ng Wee Kiat, the team is the only finalist selected from the Asia-Pacific and Greater China region.

The entry that earned the team a place in the finals is titled "IoT Detachable Waterway Monitoring Device with LoRa and Self-Sustainability". This design idea, submitted in the Smart Water Challenge track, was inspired by the recent water pollution and contamination in the state of Johor, Malaysia where 2,500 people were affected by gas poisoning and 111 schools were closed as a result of illegally dumped chemical wastes in the river.

Keysight IoT Challenge Programme Director Cheryl Ajluni said, "UTAR's student innovators set a very high bar with their entry, providing an outstanding example of how lowpower sensor networks hold the potential to make the world better for billions of people."

Two students from the UTAR team will receive an all-expenses paid trip to the final competition in New York City on September 2019. The judges of the competition include a United Nations officer, a top student innovator and entrepreneur, a popular social influencer and an industry-renowned writer.

The winners will be announced in September. Along with worldwide recognition, the top winning team will receive a \$50,000 USD cash prize and \$50,000 USD worth of Keysight test equipment for their school.

t was a jubilant occasion for 2,843 graduates of UTAR when they received their respective postgraduate and undergraduate degrees at UTAR's 29th Convocation. The graduates celebrated their academic achievement together with dignitaries, lecturers and staff from UTAR at Dewan Tun Dr Ling Liong Sik in Kampar Campus from 16 to 18 August 2019. The graduation ceremony was a threeday celebration of the graduands' perseverance, determination and their dedication to the ideals of UTAR.

A total of 2,843 graduands from 97 programmes comprising 66 Bachelor (Hons) degree, 22 Master's degree and nine PhD programmes, received their convocation scrolls in four sessions held over the three-day period. Kem yang dianjurkan tersebut mendapat sambutan yang memberangsangkan daripada parapelajar dengan pengisian acaranya seperti sesi suai kenal, permainan menarik, bengkel hands-on dan sesi perkongsian yang boleh mendidik dan membentuk mereka menjadi seorang pemimpin sama ada di peringkat sekolah dan seterusnya peringkat universiti.

Seorang peserta dari SMK Perempuan Methodist Ipoh Ramyasree Suria Naidu memberitahu dia berasa amat bertuah kerana dipilih oleh guru untuk menyertai kem kepimpinan tersebut. Ramyasree berkata, saya mendapat banyak ilmu yang sangat berguna untuk menjadi seorang pemimpin yang berwibawa seperti penerapan nilai kerjasama, sifat bertolak ansur, hormat-menghormati serta menghargai pendapat orang lain. Ia merupakan nilai-nilai kehidupan yang perlu dipraktikkan dalam kehidupan seharian."
